SPAN majors may not take a survey course during their fourth year, unless on Language & Linguistics track; or if they began upper-level Spanish study late enough that it would have been impossible to have taken the survey course any earlier, including the summer prior to their 4 th year.

DISTINGUISHED MAJOR PROGRAM (DMP) REQUIREMENTS - 2 ADDITIONAL COURSES

DMPs must complete **12 courses** post-high school (that is, AP credit does not count as one of these 12 courses)

12. SPAN 4989 DMP Thesis (taken Spring 4th year as Graded Option; 3 credit hours with your thesis advisor as the instructor)

- SPAN 3300 must be taken at UVa or through a recommended study abroad program. It must be completed before continuing to survey and literature and culture courses.
- **Completing one survey course is a prerequisite for taking any 4000-level literature and culture course. Ideally a major will take both surveys before advancing to a 4000-level course in literature or culture.**
- **Fourth-year majors may not take a survey course; they must substitute a 4000-level literature and culture course instead. The substitute course must be in the same area as the survey being replaced** (e.g. a Latin American literature and culture course for a Latin American literature survey or a Spanish literature and culture course for a Spanish literature survey).
- **AP Language exam:** Students with a score of 4 should proceed to 3010. Students with a score of 5 place out of 3010 and may not take it for credit; they may proceed to any of the following: SPAN 3300, 3000, 3020, 3030, 3031, 3200, 3040, 3050, 3060, or 3070.
- **AP Literature exam:** Students with a score of 4 should proceed to 3300. Students with a score of 5 place out of 3010 and 3300 and may not take either for credit; they may take any SPAN course at the 3000 level, EXCEPT 3010 and 3300. Students who are placed out of SPAN 3300 must still earn 30 credits of upper-division Spanish to complete the major, substituting another literature and culture course for SPAN 3300.
- Only one conversation course can count toward the major. Conversation classes are closed to native speakers.
- **Course exceptions must be approved by the student's Major Advisor AND the Director of Undergraduate Programs, currently Alicia López-Operé (al7d@virginia.edu)**
